Structure PPP to support China's advantage rice production technology transfer to Mozambique and rice value chain development in Zambezia province

Partner: Hubei Dadi, World Bank, TechnoServe

	Context and objective	<ul> <li>The pilot project goal is to transfer Chinese smart-agriculture technology and water management skills, and to increase yield from 3.5 ton/ha to 6 ton/ha in the pilot area. In the long run, the goal is to bring Chinese investors, structure a Private-Public-Partnership to develop Zambezia rice value chain.</li> <li>This pilot will be in cooperation with Mozambique government, World Bank, TechnoServe/BMGF, a leading Chinese think tank (China Academy of Science) that will provide technical assistance, and Chinese technicians from Chinese private sector rice producers as implementation partner.</li> </ul>	
-	Progress	<ul> <li>Rice cultivated in 2018-2019 Rain season; Beans and Maize cultivated in 2019 Dry season</li> <li>Reached 35 households on 80 hectare of lands</li> <li>7 Training session conducted</li> <li>Key partners convened in September 2019 and finalized rain season plantation plan, including implementing unit set-up, establishment of monitoring and evaluation mechanism</li> <li>Reached agreement with district agriculture bureau on water use management structure for 2019-2020 rain season</li> </ul>

#### **Burkina Faso: Rice Flagship Program**



**Problem:** Ambiguity around rice strategy and priorities, lack of incentive to coordinate across different programs, lack of resource mobilization function to engage donors, and no flagship with institutional backing

We supported the development of a coherent, coordinated flagship program

AGRA supported prioritization, design, and resource mobilization...

AGRA helped **engage government to align on priority investment,** facilitating meetings with senior ministry officials



Month rapid design process, including consultations



**High-impact TA** areas: (1) design; (2) partner and resource mobilization, PPP enhancement, results tracking

600M

**Funding mobilized** from government of Burkina Faso, World Bank, IFAD, Islamic Development Bank, Saudi Development Fund, KfW ...leading to gov't ownership, private sector commitment, and projected scale impact



Flagship profile elevated to **Presidential Rice Initiative** due to food security, reduced imports



Hectares, equivalent to 40% of program area, committed to by private sector



Households with projected direct benefits, including 30K women and 20K youth





#### Global good prices is taking a sharp increase






#### While good harvest since 2019

- The Latest COVID19 Waves in South Asia and Southeast Asia might pose serious threat to food security in Africa, particularly for rice consuming countries, since India (~50%, or 15 million tons), Pakistan, Thailand,, Vietnam all rank the top rice exporters. Russia is taking lead to limit agro export.
- China imported 140 million metric tons of agro in 2020, a historic high in history for the country and for the world.
- From the Swine Flu to the COVID pandemic, it is clear that it is the fluctuation of global food price and disruption of international food market impacted China's own food security greatly, not domestic agriculture production and circulation.
- So that only the food security problem solved in the global south, especially in African, could China truly realize food security for its own population.
- Let us keep on talk about this at AGRF 2021 !
