BACKGROUND

Rice has become increasingly important staple food for West African household, representing 37% of the total consumption of food crops. Building a sustainable rice value chain will eventually contribute to ending hunger and improving food security. The development of the rice industry in China has contributed greatly to overall economic development, agricultural transformation, and poverty eradication. Through South-South Cooperation, the experience and lessons learned at the technical and policy level from China could assist the African rice stakeholders in addressing some of the challenges by leveraging the Chinese good practices in rice production, processing, post-harvest management and market access. WFP China COE initiated and co-organized the Rice Value Chain Seminar in 2021 and 2022, together with the UNOSSC and CERFAM. These events also received support from the MARA, NAFRA, BMGF, CICETE, CAD Fund and AGRA. Through the seminars, stakeholders have enhanced policy exchange and strengthened partnerships between public

and private sectors to accelerate the further development of China-Africa rice value chain to end hunger and reduce poverty.

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE RICE SEMINAR 2022

- **232** participants from **33** countries including representatives from public sector, private sector and CSOs attended the Seminar online and offline.
- **10** experts from China and Africa delivered presentations on **Rice Processing, storage, and Quality Control**.
- **2** technical trips to the Grain Reserves Depot and Rice Industry Companies.
- **3** side events related to SSC, partnerships bringing and RVC Project.

- **Document and widely share the experience** derived from this project with countries in Africa.
